

ACTS CHAPTER 17

Paul and Silas continued their missionary journey and went to Thessalonica. There was a synagogue there, but it seems there might not have been a lot of Jews in the area. Paul went to the synagogue for three sabbath days, telling them about Jesus and how he was the Messiah. Paul used the Old Testament to teach them Jesus as there wasn't a New Testament yet. Some were converted, however there were more of the Greeks that were converted. It seems that the Greeks who were converted may have been "worshipping Greeks" that already feared God.

The Jews that didn't convert, became upset and found some men in the area to stir up trouble in the city. They went to Jason's house, where Paul and Silas were staying, and searched for them.

They weren't there, so they turned their anger towards Jason and some others and drug them before city magistrates stating that they had upset the world! Isn't it amazing how upset people can get when God is doing a work? They accused them of going against the Roman law by proclaiming Jesus as King. Jesus is the King of Kings, but He wasn't a King opposed to Caesar. They must have thought that since that accusation was able to get Jesus crucified, it would work against the disciples also. The magistrates required Jason to pay a security, probably something like what we consider a bail or bond today and they let them go. The brethren sent Paul and Silas away by night.

They then went to Berea. The people in Berea, were more educated than the people in Thessalonica, which caused them to be more inquisitive and apt to do more studying. They were known to daily examine the scriptures to see if what Paul was telling them was true and because of this, many believed. The unbelieving in Thessalonica were still upset and heard that the word of God was being preached in Berea. They went there to stir up the people there, trying to stop the work God was doing. Once again, Paul was sent away to go to Athens, but Timothy and Silas remained. A short time later, Paul sent for them to come to be with him right away and they left.

While Paul waited for them to show up, he saw that the city was given over to idols. I read that the people of Athens may have worshipped as many as 30,000 statues of gods! Paul then would go into the synagogue and the marketplace to preach the gospel. Seeing all the idolatry drove him to go preach to the people of Athens. He didn't care where or to whom he preached, he just had to go preach to them! If we did this, maybe we would be accused of turning our world upside down!

Some of the local philosophers heard Paul. They brought him to Areopagus, and they asked Paul about this new doctrine that he was teaching. As Paul came up to Mars' Hill, he saw the many statues of the gods that they worshipped and an altar "To the Unknown God". He began to speak to them, telling them that they were a very religious people, but they didn't know who that "unknown God" was, and he was going to tell them.

From what I have read, Paul was in the habit of inserting "Jesus" in place of Jehovah in the Old Testament. So, he was basically doing the same thing here where the Greeks had left an opening. He was just letting them know that this God's name was Jesus. Paul then began to tell them about God beginning in Genesis and continued though that time. The Mars' Hill sermon is an awesome description of who God is, but due to space constraints, I cannot include it here, but I encourage you to go read it, Acts 17:23-31. When Paul began to tell them about the resurrection, some didn't believe but others wanted to talk to Paul some more about it. When Paul left them, some of the men stayed with him and believed.

ACTS CHAPTER 18

Paul then left Athens and went to Corinth. He met Aquila and his wife Priscilla and stayed with them because Aquila was also a tent maker. Every sabbath Paul would go to the synagogue and talk to the Jews and Greeks. By the time Timothy and Silas arrived, Paul had devoted most of his time to preaching. When some or the people would come against him, he would shake his clothes and tell them "Your blood be upon your head. I am clean. From now on I will go to the Gentiles." This follows what Jesus had taught the disciples. Jesus told them in Matthew 10:14 to shake the dust off their feet when people rejected their message of the Messiah.

After leaving the synagogue, Paul went to a house next door that belonged to a man named Justus, who was a worshipper of the Lord. Crispus. Very likely a Greek that believed in God. Cristus, the leader of the synagogue, believed on the Lord with all his house and many Corinthians also believed and were baptized. It's odd that just moving next door made it possible for Crispus to believe.

One night, the Lord spoke to Paul in a vision, telling him to not be afraid, to speak (preach) because the Lord was with him and no one will hurt him because many people in the city were God's. Paul must have felt the opposition building; he had to be a bit anxious about what could happen. So, the Lord encouraged him and brought him peace. Paul ended up staying there for a year and a half teaching the word. It doesn't say how many people believe in the Lord from this, but we can only imagine what a revival would be like with Paul as the preacher! Eventually, the opposition did come, and the Jews brought Paul before the judgement seat. They brought him before Gallio who didn't care about Jewish law, only Roman law. This was a legal matter, not religious. In this day, the Jews were allowed to make converts if they weren't Román citizens. Gallio said that he had no problem with Paul, it was a religious matter, and he wasn't willing to judge it and made them leave.

The Jews were angry at this and took Sosthenes the ruler of the synagogue, before Gallio and beat him (possibly because he hadn't won their case before Gallio earlier). But again, Gallio dismissed them. Paul stayed for a while longer then left for Syria with Priscilla and Aquila.

They all went to the city of Ephesus and Paul left them and went to the synagogue to speak with the Jews. They wanted him to stay for a while, but he would not. When he left them, he let them know he was leaving due to the feast in Jerusalem that he needed to keep but if it was God's will, he would return. We should never presume what we will do or not do when we are trying to follow the will of God for our lives. We are not promised tomorrow, we should always say, Lord willing I will do such and such (see James 4:15). What we or someone else wants comes second to what God wants for our lives!

Paul then left and went to Caesarea, greeted the church there, then left there and went down to Antioch, after a bit he left and went to Galatia and Phrygia strengthening all the disciples. I can just imagine that anywhere Paul preached, the disciples would have been encouraged and strengthened.

Apollos, a Jew from Alexandrian, went to Ephesus. He was a well-educated man and knowledgeable in the scriptures. He began to teach the things concerning Jesus, but he had only known the baptism of John. It's possible Apollos had already received the Holy Ghost because he was "fervent in the spirit". It's not clear here to say yes or no, but we do know he had not yet been baptized in Jesus' name. Aquila and Priscilla heard about Apollos and took him off to "fill in the blanks" of what he didn't know. Apollos must have been a powerful preacher in his day; he gained the confidence of the brethren and was given a letter of recommendation (Paul referenced this letter in I Cor 1:12). He was able to convince the Jews, showing them that Jesus was Christ. His knowledge of the Old Testament scriptures and his zeal for the Lord, through the power of the Spirit, he was able to accomplish many things.

Giving my life to Jesus is the best thing I've ever done!



CARBOHYDRATE THREE - WHOLE OR REFINED?*

Most wheat flour is refined, but the word "refined" is rarely used. So how can one know if bread is made from whole or refined flour? Look at the ingredient list, and if it specifies that the flour is flour, wheat flour, enriched, bleached, unbleached, fortified, organic, or anything else, it's refined. Always consider it to be refined unless it says "whole". It can be part whole

unless it says "whole". It can be part whole and part refined, in which case the two flours will be listed as separate ingredients, one of which will say whole.

Now breads are often made of mixed grain flours and/or seeds, and some with no wheat at all. I don't know of a hard and fast rule with these other flours; some are labeled whole, while others, though unspecified, I believe are often whole as well.

What about pasta? It'll probably say durum wheat semolina. Even if it's organic, it's still refined unless it says "whole".

And non-wheat pastas; they're made from a lot of different things, but I believe the non-wheat pasta grains are often whole even if

not so specified.

What about rice? If it's white, enriched, parboiled, or often just "rice", etc., it's refined. But If it's brown, black, purple, or red, it's whole. But just what is white rice? It's milled brown rice; refined* from brown rice. And in the case of the African pink rice in one store, it's partially milled red rice, with only part of the germ and bran having

PURIFIED. Sugar (100% sucrose): This is the worst one of all. It depresses the immune system for a few hours after ingestion. No nutrients, no fiber, just empty calories. It is listed as an ingredient in some products that also say "All Natural" somewhere on the package. Don't be deceived by those words "All Natural". God didn't make purified carbohydrate. If it doesn't occur in nature, how can it be "natural"? Man's food establishment must interpret the word "natural" very B - R - O - A - D - L - Y.

I don't generally buy products with added sugars. But if in the ingredients sugar is listed only after salt, or the Nutrition Facts label lists 0 grams added sugars, then I can buy it.

SYMPLIFIED. Added Sugars: Look on the Nutrition Facts label for this under the Carbohydrate Listing, measured in grams per serving.

Juices: fruit, vegetable. I think it is okay to keep some canned juice on hand for when you're sick in bed for short term temporary use only

Milks: grain (rice milk, etc.), legume (soy milk, etc.), nut (almond milk, coconut milk,

Water: (coconut water, etc.)

CONCENTRATED. Such as maple syrup, coconut sugar, molasses, blackstrap** molasses, and many others, (accounted for on the Nutrition Facts label as Added Sugars); and Dehydrated fruit.***

REFINED. Grain to make flour. **CARBOHYDRATE TWO**, paragraphs 5 and 6, would be a good review source for what it is and what's wrong with it for us.

*MY OWN CLASSIFICATIONS; DESCRIPTIONS ELSEWHERE PROBABLY NON-COINCIDING

**BLACKSTRAP IS THE CONCENTRATE REMAINING AFTER THE THIRD AND FINAL EXTRACTION OF SUCROSE FROM CAIN JUICE TO MAKE SUGAR. THE REMAINING COMPOSITION STILL IS SUGARS, BUT WITH ALL THE NUTRIENTS LEFT BEHIND NOW IN VERY CONCENTRATED FORM, THIS WOULD MAKE IT MUCH BETTER THAN SUGAR TO USE IN BAKING.

***DEHYDRATED FRUIT (RAISIN, DATE, PINEAPPLE, ETC.), NOT FOR SNACKING BECAUSE OF THE CONCENTRATED SUGARS, BUT A GOOD SUBSTITUTE FOR SUGAR IN BAKING.
