Just like the previous courtroom scenario, the witness does not become a true witness till they open their mouths and testify, declare or confess. In Matthew 5:16 it says, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." The Lord Jesus wants us to be the billboard (evidence) of his power that changes lives and makes them better. He wants us to display holiness before an unbelieving generation. However, in Acts 1:8 Jesus tells us to be witnesses "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the utmost part of the earth." How to pray over your house for Spiritual Cleaning & Blessing

Psalm 84:4 Blessed are they that dwell in thy house: they will be still praising thee.

• This house belongs to God

Proverb 12:7 The wicked are overthrown and are not: but the house of the righteous shall stand.

- 1. Remove any items that represent or invite evil into the house and get rid of them.
 - a. Pornography
 - b. Horror movies and novels
 - c. Dark or evil music: black metal, that which glorifies sexual immorality/drug use, etc.
 - d. Spiritual/evil games: Ouija boards, tarot cards, crystal balls, palm reading, psychic/new age, etc. (anything that has to do with spiritual that is not Christian)
 - e. Religious/spiritual items from anything that is not Christian: Idols carved religious figurines, idols from other cultures, voodoo dolls, Buddha statues/figurines, dream catchers, etc.
- 2. Pray for cleansing, consecration, blessing and protection. OUT LOUD!
 - a. Something like this:

"Father God, I come before you, knowing that the blood of Jesus presents me righteous before you. Thank you for my salvation, victory and authority over evil that is mine in Jesus Christ! It is in the name of my Savior Jesus Christ I ask for your cleansing, blessing and protection over this household. Thank you, Lord.

By the blood of Jesus Christ, I bind every evil and unclean spirit that is in this house and command them to flee right now in the name of Jesus Christ. I renounce and reject any inch of this house and property that has been yielded or surrendered unto Satan and by faith I take it back and surrender it to the Lord Jesus Christ. I renounce and repent of any sins, known or unknown to me, that have been committed here by anyone including me or my family. I renounce and repent of any sinful items ever kept here, I renounce and repent of any sinful things that were broadcast here in Jesus's name. Forgive any trespasses committed against you in this place Lord!

In the name of Jesus Christ, I dedicate and consecrate this house to my Lord Jesus Christ and claim it is under His divine protection from the top of the roof to the bottom of the footing and everything in between. Father, I ask in the name of Jesus Christ that you would surround this house and the property on which it stands with a hedge of protection. Surround our family and this property with your favor as with a shield on all sides, above and below. Father God, I ask that You send your powerful warrior angels to protect the Four corners of this house and property, guarding everyone who lives within. I ask this house to be consecrated with Your divine presence so that everyone who enters will be blessed in their heart, soul, and mind. May your love, joy, and peace be palpable in this place by the power of your Holy Spirit. May this be a place of rest and restoration. Thank you, Father for the complete victory I already have in Jesus Christ. Let your Kingdom come, Your will be done on earth and in this home as it is in heaven. As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord. Amen."

3. Walk through every single room (bedrooms, bathrooms, kitchen, living room, entryway, basement, attic, etc.) standing in the center of each and pray the following short prayer OUT LOUD:

"In the name of Jesus Christ, I cast out any clean spirit from this room and forbid them from ever entering again. Father, I ask you to bless this room with your presence and that it would be a place of rest, joy and peace. Amen."

4. Go to every door and window and pray this short payer OUT LOUD. (as an optional act of faith) anoint each doorframe and window with olive oil, representing Jesus' blood. blessing, favor, and protection.

"In the name of Jesus Christ, I forbid any unclean or evil spirits or forces from entering this home Father, send your angels to stand guard here. Amen"


5. Go to the end of your driveway or entrance to your property and pray this short prayer OUT LOUD:

True Worship


Read John 4:1-42

Chapter 5

The money was put in a common fund and when someone had a need, they were given out of this fund to provide for the need. One day, Ananias and Sapphira sat down together and conspired to see their property and donate a portion of the price they received. Now, one thing to remember, they were under no obligation to give it all, they didn't even have to give any if they chose. They could have given half, and it would have been accepted and appreciated. But they decided to lie and say that was all they got for their property and keep the balance. Ananias went in to the apostles and laid the amount he and Sapphira agreed upon at the apostles' feet. The scripture doesn't say that is what Ananias said but from the context, what he told the apostles was a lie. Peter, through the Holy Ghost, knew that this was only a portion of the money and not the total amount that Ananias claimed it was. Peter then asked Ananias, wasn't this property yours? Even after you sold it, wasn't within your power to do what you wanted to do with it? Why are you lying about it? You didn't have to lie about it. You didn't lie to men, you lied to God. Immediately, the judgement of God fell and Ananias died. They took him out and buried him unceremoniously.

About three hours later, Sapphira came in. Peter, seeing her asked her how much they sold the property for. When she continued the lie, he asked her why she lied and began to tell her that her husband was dead and then she fell dead. They came back in and picked her up and buried her with her husband.

If the sin of Ananias and Sapphira had been allowed to go unpunished, others would have followed suit. The reputation of the church would have been tarnished and could have destroyed the newly formed church. But because of the swift and hard judgement of God against them, fear and respect was given to the whole church and people outside of the church that heard about it.

After this, the Lord began to bless the church and there were many new converts. Signs and wonders were following the apostles and the people held them in high esteem. The people had such a faith in God and respect for the apostles that they would lay their sick on cots and mats hoping that Peter's shadow would fall on them and they would be healed. The people who were sick and possessed by evil spirits were all healed.

Because of the works that was being done, the Sadducees and the High Priest got the apostles and put them in prison. But God sent an angel to open the prison doors and let them out. The angel told them to go into the temple and to speak the words of this life.

The next morning, when the High Priest sent for them, they found that they weren't there. They found that the prison was still shut up but no one was there. The High Priest and the captain of the temple couldn't believe


that they had gotten out of prison. Then, someone came and let them know that they were in the temple teaching!

Gamaliel, a doctor of the law then stood up and told them. They should just leave the apostles alone. If they weren't of God, the movement would end soon enough and if they were of God, nothing they would do could stop it. It doesn't say this, but I think he knew what the apostles were teaching was true. True to what Gamaliel said, nothing that the Jews or the devil has been able to stop what God has set into motion!



Chapter 6

Chapter 6 opens with there being some controversy with the Greek speaking Jews. They were upset because they felt that their widows weren't being taken care of like the other, Aramaic speaking widows. It's possible it was due to the language barrier or a cultural difference that they weren't receiving what the others were getting. But this disunity could have damaged all the work that was being done to further along the kingdom of God.

The disciples, "the twelve" were called together and they called the multitude of the other disciples and worked on the solution. They decided to appoint seven honest men, that were full of the Holy Ghost to take care of the situation. They appointed Stephen, Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas, and Nicolas a proselyte of Antioch. They laid hands on them and prayed.

With these duties being delegated to others, the twelve were then able to devote themselves to prayer and to preaching the word of God. God continued to bless the church and it grew greatly and even some of the Jewish priests were obedient to the faith.

After this, Stephen's ministry began to flourish, and the working of miracles extended beyond the original twelve.

These people were former Jewish slaves and descendants of freed slaves. They were arguing with Stephen, accusing him of speaking blasphemously against Moses and God. They, however, were no match for Stephen and the Holy Ghost. So they persuaded witnesses to accuse him of blasphemy before the council. During all of this, Stephen had peace and as they looked upon him, they saw his face as if it were the face of an angel.

ANY GIVEN SUNDAY PART 2


